


PRODUCTION RESULTS



AUSTRALIAN PROFIT RANKING (APRs).....More Flawed Science?

Recently we saw the publication of the latest release of the Australian Profit Rankings (APRs) by Australian Dairy herd Improvement scheme (ADHIS). Coinciding with this release we witnessed Artificial Breeding Companies taking full page advertisements to proudly display their lineup of "leading" sires.

Dairy Farmers are urged to use these simplistic figures to select sires for profitability.

ADHIS staff state: "The APR takes the hard work out of selecting for profit. It is the simple and effective way to identify sires whose genetics will translate into profitable daughters". And "The APR is an easy way to make good choices. A bull with an APR of 100 is \$50 more profitable than a bull with an APR of 50".

"ADHIS manages Australia's national independent dairy genetic evaluation system on behalf of farmers with the aim of maximizing the rate of genetic gain for net profit. The APR is used to ranking bulls according to their ability to produce profitable dairy cows under Australian dairy conditions. The APR takes into account input costs related to production, maintenance and rearing. To develop a herd which is efficient and profitable under Australian conditions, ADHIS advocates the use of A.I. bulls, which rank highly for net profit under Australian conditions.

Before proceeding any further I would ask the question do they actually understand the real definition of NET PROFIT? Collins Dictionary - Net - remaining after all deductions.

APRS are deduced by applying a formula using ABV's. What is behind the formula is termed the economic weightings. When one first looks at these weightings it can appear overwhelming. For this reason I believe farmers (unfortunately) never question these figures. When one takes a look at the weightings and compares them to the real world - terms such as profit - let alone net profit - seem completely irrelevant.

From the ADHIS website the Economic weightings behind APRS:

Protein ABV X 3.8 + Fat EBV x 0.9 - Milk ABV x 0.048

+ Survivability Index	- 100 x 3.276
+ Milking Speed ABV	- 100 x 1.090
+ Temperament ABV	- 100 x 1.086
+ Cell Count ABV	- 100 x 0.34
+ Liveweight ABV	- 100 x 1.248
+ Daughters Fertility ABV	- 100 x 1.67

Do not be overcome by these numbers. Note the weighting for protein is 3.8 and Fat is 0.9. This formulation allocates the value of **Protein at 4.22 TIMES the value of Fat**. Compare this with the analysis of payment structure for 1,000 litres of milk taken from a Victorian producer's returns.. Using components of 4.1% Fat & 3.3% Protein - the Protein value (at \$5.46/kg) is \$180.18; the Fat value (at \$2.18/kg) is \$89.38.

So the ACTUAL ratio between the value of the Protein and the Fat Content in a litre of milk is 2.02 (\$180.18/\$89.38). In other words the dollar value of the Protein content in 1 litre of Milk compared to the Fat is 2.02 times greater or virtually double. **Not 4.22 times as used in APR calculations.**

I suggest for APR's to have ANY accuracy - using the above weightings - Farmers would need to be being paid \$11.41 for Protein when receiving \$2.18 for Fat. Formulations used in calculating APRS have Protein at weighted at 4.22(3.8/0.9) times Fat. ACTUAL ANALYSIS (using above example) of how farmers (in Victoria) are being paid reveals the Protein content is worth 2.02 times Fat.

422% in the APRs and 202% in the Actual Dollar Values. With this discrepancy - how can it be suggested APRs could possibly be (in any way) an indicator of Profit - let alone Net Profit?

And the picture again - desk designed breeding values - and farmers investing heavily in the results and HOW can these projections increase profits? So here we have the same picture - farmers investing valuable, hard earned dollars - in questionable science.

Returning to Net Profit: Two of the Holsteins of breed's major problems are fertility & calving difficulties:

FERTILITY: In these latest release of APRs for Holsteins sires- **ONLY 5** of the top 15 bulls listed in the August 2009 Top 200 APR Publishable Holstein have daughter fertility ABVs. One can only conclude fertility is not considered important in the Net Profit calculations.

DYSTOCIA: Whilst some bulls have calving ease ABVs this figure is not included in economic weightings. And we are talking about Net Profit in a breed which has major calving difficulties!!!!!! No doubt they do not have to deliver a lot of calves at the desk where these figures were designed.

APRs are clearly Production - Not Profit - Indices. Livestock production "aids" have great confusion with the word production and profit.

Productivity, productivity gain, genetic gain - all these 'catch cries' have driven farmers into high input, high cost of production systems. There has been NO gain in efficiency of production - in fact the reverse. The 2008 Australia Dairy In Focus report states the National average production per cow in 1997-98 was 4,677 litres. In 2007-08 it was 5,231 litres. A total increase of 554 litres/cow/year over a 10 year period.

Where is the genetic gain? Our cows are being fed at least 1 ton of grain more that 10 years ago. One ton of grain is mooted to return 1,000 litres of milk. Our 'modern' (incorrectly designed dairy cow) cannot even return what they are supposed to (1000 litres for 1 ton of grain) let alone any production supplements they are being supplied (along with the extra grain)-compared to a decade ago. No Gain - only **FINANCIAL PAIN**.

Farmers wake up - questions what you are being told - low milk prices are not your biggest problem.




