# NAVILLUS

R & M WILSON

I was born into farming and Jersey cattle and used to go to shows with my parents who ran the "NAVILLUS" stud. (Navillus was my mums maiden name backwards). The Navillus name was used for 6 generations for their properties.

1969 our stud was commenced when we were allocated a block on the Heytsbury Settlement at Simpson with the help of greatful references from Reg Broad and Murray Maloney, 18 Belgonia bred heifers from Lindsay and Bob Archibald and a Francliff bull - Ingham. A line of heifers from "Wongamurlie" stud were purchased. After 2 years and "Norleen Vale" Annette 18 and N.V. Patricia were purchased from Norm Podger. They gave us very much enjoyment as they were our 1st show cows. "Annette" was our 1st Champion and beat Rosevale Dawn who won champion Jersey cow at Melbourne Royal. We were fortunate to purchase "Katandra Silvermine 119" (by Francliff Illusionist) from Des Vallence and she was the Dam and background of our famous "Silvermine" family and also show cow. Our 1st "Navillus" bred show cow was "Navillus Nita" and was sold at the Francliff Invitation sale which we patronised for many years. We also purchased cattle from there to start up our own different cow families.

## NAVILLUS BERYL 20



We purchased "Francliff Bestman - Tarnhowe Gay Sambo,

Francliff Buttercup 6 to breed over Katandra Silvermine 119 and her progeny and joined every female to him. His daughters proved to be big winners in all aspects - beautiful deep bodies, with lovely type udders and high producers who won numerous championships and production awards at Melbourne Royal etc.

Then it came time to purchase another bull to go over "Bestman" daughters. A trip to New Zealand previously to look for bull mothers and sought out "Tarnhowe Jolly Louella" and "Kakariki Choice Delight" and as a result "Elenko Louellas Sam" and "Denson Dale Delights Sam" were purchased over the next few years.

I was fortunate enough to get "Katandra Royal Jingo" semen so I selected the best cow families to line breed champions and high producers. Our "Sunflower" family was probably the most successful family with "Sunflower 5 & 9" winning Dam and Daughter at Melbourne Royal 5 years in a row and always in the 1st 4 in their respective classes along with the production awards.

A news reporter at Melbourne once stated in the "Age" that Sunflower 5 was the "Marilyn Munroe" of Jersey cows. N. Sunflower 24 (by Ferdon Coms Fantastic) and N. Sunflower 42 (by Grandeur Dreaming Sam) gave us a lot of enjoyment towards the end and our greatest highlight was breeding and winning champion cow with "N. Love Lies 21" at Melbourne in 1992 and along with her daughter were 1st and 2nd in the best vessel class. Another highlight of our showing experiences was breeding "Navillus Love Lies 12" (by Francliff Bestman), who won her class 4 times in milk at Melbourne Royal, described by leading judges as the best cow ever at "Navillus" and I agree - just ask John Cherry!

Judging day in Melbourne saw an influx of overseas visitors and well wishes and prominent judges congratulating us on our show team preparation when we started showing in Melbourne our team consisted of 13 always, which for the majority of years was milking cows and a bull. I did not like to show heifers as I found the preparation made them to gross and ruining them for when they calved as 2 year olds.



# NAVILLUS

With the cold climate at Simpson we built a shed for the cows to calve in, to rear the calves in and to prepare the show cows in. Things changed when we moved to Katandra and preparing show teams was a lot easier. Once the show season came round we patronised every show in the circuit plus any dairy fairs and Melbourne Royal. We brought the 100 acres at Katandra on the advice of late Frank Burgman and later 40 acres next door and found the climatic conditions more appealing to "man and beast". I always made sure that my whole herd was drenched and inoculated regularly and provided plenty of roughage to our show cows diet. We were always complimented on how our cattle were prepared and had such glossy coats - we were convinced that if they were healthy on the inside, it reflected on their appearance on the outside. I always considered my whole herd as a show herd and tried always to make our farm as a show place also - well limed and supered to grow the best quality feed so as to produce the best quality milk.

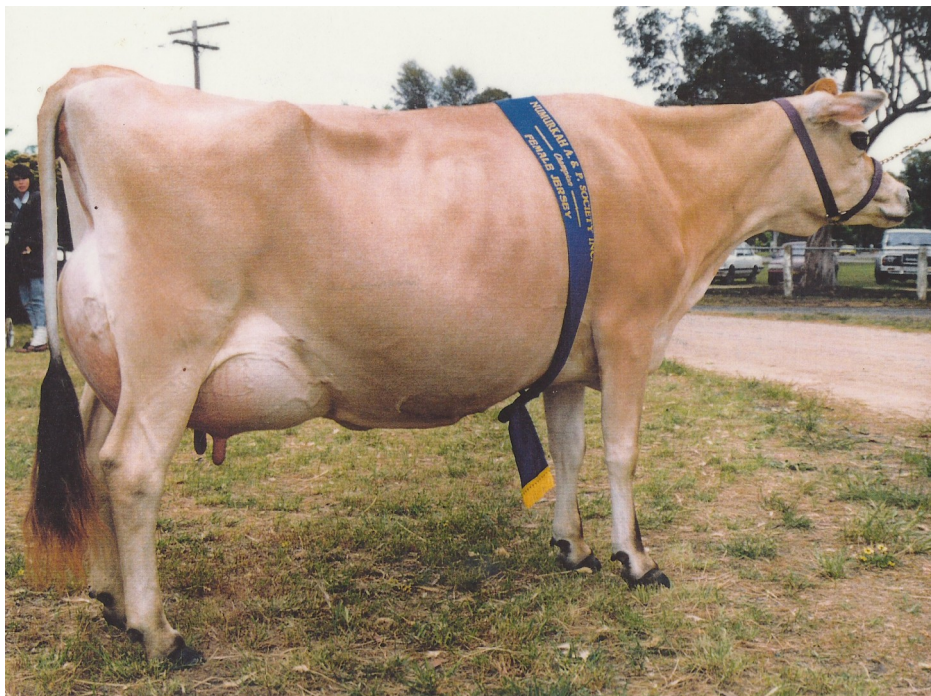
After the family members moved on in their lives we scaled down to a smaller property (70 acres) which we could cope with ourselves. We enjoyed being involved in judging, classification, calf days, heifer competitions and showing to promote our wonderful jersey cow, along with visits from heaps of overseas visitors and other cattle breeders. After a lifetime

being involved with Jerseys and old age creeping up and the drought in 2002 we sold up and retired but have kept in touch with all cattle breeders far and wide. I have been invited to judge Jerseys and dairy cattle from Queens land to Tasmania and also on several occasions in New Zealand. The biggest show I have officiated at was the Hamilton Royal with 50 - 2 year olds in milk just in 1 class.

Wonderful friendships have been made far and wide over the years through our cows, and I was always grateful to the "master breeders" who had offered me advice, encouragement and inspiration over the years. Those being the late Bert Anderson, Roy Cox, Frank Burgman, Reg Broad and Murray Maloney who is living at Gosford.

I've been very proud to stand at the top of the line in huge classes and dairy all breed classes over the years with our "Navillus" bred Jerseys and hoped we've promoted Jersey cattle around the globe to the best of our ability. Life goes on.

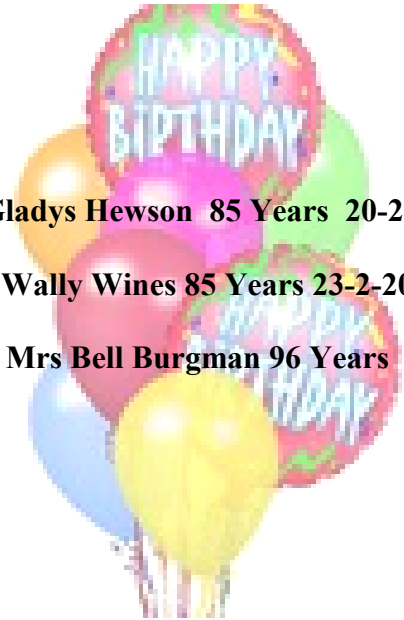

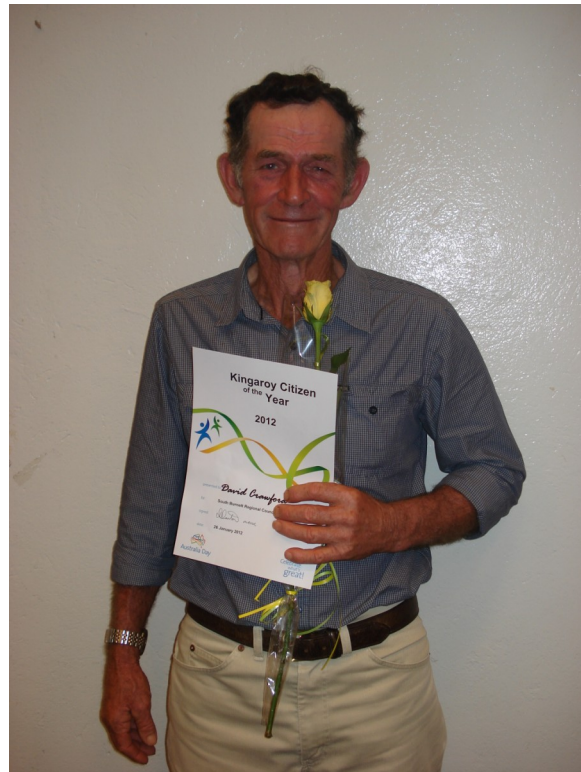

# *Eulogy for Clifford Cox 3-11-1923 - 17-01-2012*

Cliff was born at Ballarat on the 3rd November 1923. In 1929 the family moved from Miners Rest near Ballarat, to farm at Mt Scobie.

Cliff always helped on the farm from the age of 6 or 7 onwards. Milking was done by hand until 1938 when milking machines were installed. About this time Cliff left school and was given the responsibility of managing the stud Jersey herd known as "Tavistock" at Girgarre.

When brother Frank left school about 4 years later they shared the responsibility of "Tavistock", until in 1954 Cliff began "Talislea" Jersey Stud.

As a youth Cliff was involved with the Kyabram Methodist Church. As well as regularly attending services he later taught Sunday School. Cliff served for a time as a lay preacher in the Kyabram circuit and was at that time also a member of the church trust and an active member of the Young Peoples Christian Endeavour Society. He was a member of the young men's gymnasium where he acted as secretary for a period of time, and a member of the Methodist Cricket Club which re-formed after world war 2. Cliff captained the team for 8 seasons playing in the Kyabram and District Cricket Association. He also played in Country Week in Bendigo. As well as cricket Cliff was a keen footballer, playing in the Kyabram and District Association and for 7 seasons in the Goulburn Valley League.

Cliff was a gifted farmer and his achievements were many. They include being a member of the committee of the Kyabram Agricultural, Horticultural and Pastoral Society in the 1950's; a life member of the Northern District Jersey Cattle Club where he served on the committee and as a President for a term; he was a life member of the Pure Jersey Breeders of Australia and served on their committee. At the age of 18 Cliff was appointed to the panel of Judges of the Victorian branch of the Australian Jersey Herd Society and by invitation judged at in excess of 150 shows throughout Australia and New Zealand including 4 Royal Shows.

Church, sport and farming were not Cliffs only loves though. He met Fay on the Australia Day weekend in 1945 at a Christian Endeavour Rally in Kyabram. He began courting Fay very soon after and thought nothing of the many, many miles he travelled by pushbike between Girgarre and Kyabram to see her. The pushbike was Cliffs only form of transport and he rode into Kyabram for football and cricket and tennis, as well as Christian Endeavour meetings, but Thursday night after milking was the special night put aside to ride into Kyabram to visit Fay.



They were married in 1948 on the 28th August and have 3 children – Joy, Meryl and Lloyd who have wonderful loving memories of their father.

Treasured family memories include for Joy being taken by dad to the Royal Melbourne Show.

And for Meryl being one of the few who could outrun her dad when he had reason to chase after her.

And for Lloyd, every year Cliff looked forward to showtime many hours were spent by Cliff and Lloyd picking cows and bulls for the show. Then rugging them and grooming them for the big day. And every year no matter where it was, Melbourne, Shepparton or Kyabram. Cliff would enter the cattle pavilion leading a cow followed by Lloyd also leading a cow. As he passed them Cliff would greet each breeder warmly. And openly admire their exhibit often commenting on the cattle type and confirmation. Then after taking a few steps out of earshot Cliff would turn to Lloyd and say "We've got them beaten!"

Cliff also very much loved and was very much loved by his 5 grandchildren, Jay, Joel, Shana, Nicole and Daniel, and two great granddaughters Makayla and Asher Joy.
