Christmas Cake

Ingredients

510g (3 cups) Sultanas
265g (1½ cups) Sunbeam flame raisins
155g (1 cup) Currants
150g (1 cup) pitted dates, finely chopped
1 x 100g pkt red glace cherries, quartered
75g (½ cup) Ocean Spray craisins
75g (½ cup) dried pineapple, finely chopped
50g (¼ cup) mixed peel
185ml (¾ cup) brandy
2 teaspoons finely grated orange rind
Melted butter, to grease
250g butter, at room temperature
200g (1 cup, firmly packed) brown sugar
4 eggs
300g (2 cups) plain flour
2 teaspoons mixed spice
Blanched almonds, to decorate
Red glace cherries, extra, halved, to decorate
2 tablespoons brandy, extra

Method

1. Combine sultanas, raisins, currants, dates, cherries, craisins, pineapple, mixed peel, brandy and orange rind in a large bowl. Cover with plastic wrap and set aside, stirring occasionally, for 2 days to macerate.
2. Preheat oven to 150°C. Brush a round 22cm (base measurement) cake pan with melted butter to lightly grease. Line the base and side with 3 layers of non-stick paper.
3. Use an electric beater to beat butter and sugar in a bowl until pale and creamy. Add eggs, 1 at a time, beating well between each addition until just combined. Add butter mixture to fruit mixture and stir to combine. Add flour and mixed spice and stir until well combined. Spoon into prepared pan and smooth the surface. Lightly tap pan on benchtop to release any air bubbles. Arrange almonds and cherries on top of the cake.
4. Bake in oven, covered with foil, for 2 hours 40 minutes to 3 hours or until a skewer inserted into centre comes out clean. Drizzle hot cake with extra brandy. Set aside to cool before turning out.

History of Warrawee Park

Early Beginnings.

John was born and reared at Goroke, a small town in the Wimmera, Victoria. He left school at the age of 14. One of his first jobs was working at a rabbit factory. Rabbit meat was exported overseas. In the 1950's rabbits were plagued. Many people made a living from trapping and shooting them. Rabbit drives were held on sheep stations. Many funny stories are told of this enterprise. John and his family leased his uncle's butcher's shop, where he and his brother learned the trade of butchering. John liked the outdoor part looking after the animals and slaughtering, but was not keen on shop work. He was a good rifle shot and could shoot a beast dead in the paddock with one shot. He learnt to shear and followed shed in spring time. He commenced working for a farmer and learnt to cereal crop, oats, wheat & barley. He met Avis while shearing, she was helping with the cooking. John and Avis were married in 1954. They leased 500 acres with a very old house to live in, on electricity, a bath on the back verandah and a party phone line. The double fire place in the kitchen had left the house by 4 inches, hessian bags blocking the gap. John always claimed if it was raining you had to wear a rain coat to make the toast. One day while Avis was icing the Christmas cake, she heard a hissing sound, looking down saw a big brown snake, the full length of the 6 foot table. This was a sheep property, lease stated only 20 head of cattle allowed. They milked 10 cows by hand, and bought a jersey bull, later when Avis became pregnant, a two stand bucket plant was brought and 19 coloured cows were milked, no calves could be kept. They separated the milk in a small open shed behind the house, this shed was not accepted or approved of by the dairy inspector. At this farm John brought his first tractor a Massey Harris 745, brand new. John thought he was made. Together with his brother Ian they brought 485 acres, near the South Australian border, cropping land. Together they shared farmed on (Brippick and Mortat stations) and the McLaughlin's farm. Another 320 acres was purchased near Balmoral, a beautiful grazing block where the clover grew high against the red gums. This place had a small wool shed, but no house. Later the Douglas farm was acquired where Avis commenced her Jersey hobby farm, she always loved the cows and the Jerseys where considered ladies cows. John on the other hand saw a good cow any colour, he did not like a cow that did not milk, regardless of her test. In 1974 Avis became a member of the Australian Jersey Society and felt very proud. So the stud began. They had 3 children, Gary, Elizabeth & Warren. Who all helped during the school

years. Warren chose to stay on the farm. John was busy at Douglas with sheep and pigs, with a lot of travelling to markets. While Avis milked the cows. The decision came when the cream truck ceased. They chose to go dairying and try irrigation. It was hard to leave their relations and their friends. Douglas was a lovely friendly district.

The move from dry farming to irrigation.

Together with Warren farms were looked at. Shepparton, Kyabram, Katunga, Yarroweyah & Cobram. When the Eurarie farm came up for sale, it was hard not to try. They had always liked this place close to a city and milk factories. Cattle had previously been brought there. Two bulls, one from the Blonde family and one from the Velvet family and a heifer Eurarie Velvet 207. Ten more cows were purchased at the Eurarie retirement sale. They liked also the Eurarie herd with their long necks, clean shoulders, open frames and good temperament. In 1979 the Hicks family moved to Mooroopna North. Other cattle from sales of well known studs were purchased. Warren and Judy were married in 1982. They both worked extremely hard on the farm and with the show teams. As did their two sons Steven & Michael. AI was used extensively. N.Z. sires were used in the beginning. Later North American and Canadian sires were introduced. (Warrawee Park Crocodile Dundee) was placed in AI. At BSI Katandra.

History of Warrawee Park

Warrawee Park could not use this bull a lot as the blood lines were too close. Daughters classifications made to VHC & EX. Dundee's sire Cleavedale Othello (imported N.Z) His dam Warrawee Park Duchess 9, VHC EX, with three lactations over 8000 litres in the early 90's, production winner Melbourne Royal Show 1993. Her sire Grandeur Dreaming Sam, AI N.Z. her full sister Warrawee Park Duchess 24 VHC, Champion cow Adelaide Royal Show & Champion & dairy cow Shepparton National Show 1993. Eurarie Royal Diplomat was considered the best bull used at Warrawee Park. He put the stud on the map, winning five by one sire three years running, 1990, 1991 & 1992 with eight different cows. His dam Eurarie Peggy 35 was very much admired. Diplomat left soft silky udders, clean bone, great teat placement and wonderful temperament. Later the last calf of Tarnhowe Golden Crystal N.Z was bought in shares. Madely Park Larry's Chris. He left two lovely Peggy daughters one was lost unfortunately and the other Warrawee Park Peggy 22, Champion cow Shepparton National Show 1994. Showing began in the Wimmera at Goroke, Edenhope, Horsham & Nhill. The Hicks family enjoyed outstanding success with many championships at the northern district show along with majors, Shepparton National, Melbourne & Adelaide Royal's. Three Warrawee Park Goldy's ET's Progeny, of Biestar ET AI, were shown at IDW with great success, in 2006 Warrawee Park Goldy 4 (93 point) won senior 3 years In milk, best udder of show, intermediate champion and supreme Jersey cow. Other Champions include Warrawee Park Princess 18 champion and dairy cow

1986 Kyabram. Warrawee Park Ignition 7 senior champion Tatura 1993. Warrawee Park Duchess 24 champion Adelaide Royal & Shepparton National & dairy cow 1993. Warrawee Peggy 22 senior champion Shepparton National 1994. Warrawee Park Miss Velvet 18 senior champion & best udder Shepparton National 1998. Warrawee Park Silvermine 43 champion Tatura 2001. Numerous junior, intermediate, senior & reserve's championships were won over the years with many production rosettes were won at shows and production awards at Jersey clubs.

After Johns ill health in 2002 Warren and Judy took over the ownership of Warrawee Park. John and Avis have never been sorry they moved to the Goulburn Valley. They have met some lovely people in the Jersey world and were given a lot of help in the showing of this wonderful breed. They miss the farm and the Jersey cows.

Warrawee Park dispersed the herd in 2010/11 after two successful sales.

It was a privilege to work with the Jersey associations. A pleasure to input and leave genetics for this wonderful breed of cattle. Age and health have a way of catching up with folk.

John and Avis celebrated their 60th wedding anniversary on 31/07/2014.

Glenvillan Jerseys (EST. 1945) have been bred, showed and milked by Crawford's for generations. First there was Les Crawford (Great Grandfather), followed by David Crawford (Grandfather), then Clayton Crawford (father). In 1999 a new generation commenced, as Mickayla Crawford was born. Even from a young age, Mickey loved her jerseys and managed to claim all the cows in Grandad's herd as her own. As she grew, with a little help from her family, so did her knowledge of cattle. Mickey attended her first show when she was three weeks old (QLD 1st Jersey Feature, Gatton 1999) and as she got a bit older, she could be found caring for the 'team' or trying to help anywhere she could. If she wasn't doing that, she was in the ring wiping out the competition. Everyone at the shows knows Mickey as that little red head that is always wandering around the shed.

During her showing years, Mickey has picked up numerous awards and trophies in the dairy section. One such award was the junior handler's award at Mudgeraba in 2009. It was in that very muddy ring that the 10 year old planted a whopper of a kiss on the nose of her 12 month old heifer, Donna. "Mickey was very happy when she won the junior handlers award. Although that was nothing compared with her excitement when Donna won juvenile Champion" says David. At the Nanango show in 2010, she decided to try something a bit different. Instead of leading the cattle, Mickey was in the judging tent, handing out ribbons. She had been asked to be the dairy maid. Even so, she still couldn't resist jumping in and leading in a few classes.

Mickey is now 15. She attends boarding school in Dalby but on the weekends is often found on the farm doing odd jobs and helping out (when she remembers to wake up that is!). Mickey still attends as many shows as possible and competes regularly in junior handlers competitions. "The junior handler's comps are fun, but I prefer to lead in the main classes. I guess it's because I feel better when the cow is the one getting judged instead of me," she says.

Mickayla looks forward to all that the future has in store for her. "Many things could happen between now and then but all I know is that I love my jerseys and I always want to have them around me."

Eckland Jersey Stud

“Eckland Jersey Stud” was started in 1962 by Wal & Merle Wines.

Most of the early purchases came from the “Lynlea Jersey Stud” owned by John Broad at Pyramid Hill, later cattle were purchased from the “Nerring Jersey Stud” owned by Mac Bayliss from Dingee. The Eckland stud showed regularly at local shows, Noorat, Camperdown, Colac, Warrnambool, Koroit, Port Fairy, Geelong & Ballarat.

The stud won numerous champion cow & champion all breeds awards.

Lynlea Dewdrop VHC purchased for the bargain price of 65 gns. As a 2 year old at a Lynlea sale, she went on to win several show championships.

Nerring Laura 4th HC+ purchased at a Nerring reduction sale for 300gns. Proved to be a great breeder. Her first daughter Eckland Laura VHC sired by Lynlea Metaphor won numerous show championships. After winning supreme champion all breeds at Warrnambool, the judge (Mr Reg Broad) remarked that she was one of the best cows he had judged, a half sister to Eckland Laura in Eckland Laura 5 VHC won Junior Championships & then bred Eckland Laura 23 VHC, a winner of over 20 champion cows & all breed championships. Another daughter of Eckland Laura 5 was Eckland Laura 32 VHC also won many Jersey champion awards.

Another good show cow was Shiray Repeaters Romona VHC, she won over 20 championships. She was a great cow to handle & a top breeder with a high PI. S.R. Romona was bred along Nerring Bloodlines.

Bulls used over the years with success were Lynlea Metaphor closely line bred to Francliff Ideal. His daughters had lovely vessels. Some of the show champions he bred were Eckland Laura VHC, Eckland Spray 4 VHC, Eckland Lassiebell VHC & Eckland

Lassiebell 2 VHC. The Laura family features heavily in the breeding to this day.

Another cow family included in our herd is the Milkbetta family with a very strong heifer calf ratio. There has been over 200 Milkbetta's in the herd & still has a very strong influence today. Possibly the best bull used in the stud was Heatherlyn Sultan Ideal, plus rated for milk & fat. He was sired by Nerring Ideal Meteor from Hillock View Sultan Silky EXC imported from N.Z. Sultan Ideal left very good producers & several show champions. Also used with success were Nerring Sultan Sam. He was also out of Hillock View Sultan Silky EXC by Grandeur Dreaming Sam. Other bulls used were Neering Dreaming Meteor, plus rated for milk & fat, Nerrings Sam Souvenir also bred well for many years.

AI bulls Cleavedale Othello & Linmore Banners Fairlane were also used. In 1990 there were more than 50 VHC cows in the herd.

Wal & Merle were active members of the local jersey cattle club for many years. In later years Wal & Merle included Stewart & Minnie into their stud business. They all showed at the local shows until approx. 1998/99 when the farm acreage & milking numbers increased. All 'AI' is done by Stewart with some AI bulls used in these later years being JS Quicksilver Royal, Gala Park Noellas Golden Boy & Comfort Royal Alf to name a few.

Jersey's still make up 80% of the herd to this day. (would prefer 100%) up until recently Wal (age 88) milked with Stewart & Minnie in their 50 stand rotary milking 300 cows.

Approx. 12 bulls are reared every year for either sale or to breed from. With many being sold to repeat buyers. As told by Wally Wines to Minnie Wines 24/10/14.

Raywyn

The Raywyn story is interesting.

In 1953 Mrs Sylvia Askew of Sale won Reserve Champion Cow at Melbourne Royal with Lewisham Noble Beautiful VHC, she also won many Gippsland Champions and was sired by OK Franchise Noble (imp. NZ).

In 1955 they won Reserve Champion Cow at Melbourne Royal with Glenavon Duchess 10th VHC. In 1958 this cow Won Supreme Champion Dairy Cow All Breeds at Sydney Royal, she also won 44 Country Champions and produced 16310—5.8—939 lbs bf. She was sired by Glenavon Stylish Prince, a very successful sire also owned by Raywyn, he was a son of Austral Park Midwatch a most successful Sire at the Clarks of Gippsland.

So the blending of these bloodlines created the dynasty of Raywyn which was to dominate the Championship list at Royal Shows throughout Australia for the next few decades. Raywyn Beautiful Prince (Stylish Prince x L N Beautiful) was bred to Duchess 10 many times and it worked! Raywyn Her Grace was one. She won 5 1st prizes at Melbourne Royal in 1963, but died young. Her Grace was bred to Raywyn Ambition, Champion at Sydney 1965 & 2 x Reserve in Melbourne—a son of Glenavon Stylish Prince and made Raywyn Ambassador, Junior Champion Melbourne Royal 1962 & Res Snr Champion Sydney 63—became very important Sire at Katandra (see story) also siring Katandra Ambassador 5 x Champion Bull Sydney Royal also Champion at Melbourne and Adelaide for Raywyn and as mentioned the 10 x Melbourne Champion Katandra Royal Wonder.

Raywyn Grand Ambassador was another of Her Grace sons, his show record was amazing. Champion at Melbourne Royal 67, 68, 69, 72, & 73, Reserve in 70 & 71. Champion at Adelaide Royals 66, 67, 69, 70 & 71, Reserve in 68. Champion at Sydney Royal 66 & 72 along with many at the major Fairs in Gippsland, Shepparton & Camperdown over the years. Grand Ambassador sired many winners including the great cow Raywyn Grand Girl EX, Champion Cow at Adelaide Royal from 1969 to 1971 making the unique result of being Champion Cow on the same day as her own Sire was Champion for 3 years in succession! This cow won many 1st prizes also at Melbourne over many years. Her full brother Raywyn Grand Pal also won many including Junior Champion at Adelaide Royal in 67 and Junior Champion Melbourne Royal 67 and Reserve Junior in 1968 and Reserve Senior Champion at Melbourne in 72, 73, & 74. Reserve Champion at

Adelaide Royal 69, 70, & 71 and Reserve Champion at Sydney Royal in 72, each time being beaten by his Sire (except in 74 at Melbourne when the Ambassador Son Royal Wonder did) Raywyn Grand Combination (by RGA) was Reserve Junior Champion at Adelaide Royal and Melbourne Royal in 69 and Junior Champion at Sydney Royal in 70 and then was sold to Kreeside and was Champion at Adelaide in 72 and Reserve in 73 and sired the Junior Champion in 75.

These genetics kept on doing it. Raywyn Grand Manuel a son of RGA was 1st 3 yo & Champion at Melbourne Royal 71, he was also Reserve Junior Champion at Adelaide Royal 70 His son Raywyn Prince Manuel won Junior Champion at Melbourne Royal 74. Reserve Senior Champion in 76, his full brother Raywyn Prince Manuel 2 was Reserve Junior Champion at Melbourne Royal 77.

The mating of Grand Manuel to Grand Girl bred Raywyn Royal Manuel Junior Champion and Senior Champion Bull Adelaide Royal in 73, Reserve Champion 74 and Champion in 75 for Kreeside and Raywyn Quality Manuel Reserve Junior Champion Melbourne Royal 75 and Reserve Senior Champion in 78 and again in 1981. A later son of Grand Girl, born when she was 18! Raywyn Great Kingdom x Katandra Star Kingdom was Reserve Junior Champion at Melbourne Royal in 85.

The exchange of Katandra and Raywyn animals worked along for several years. Apart from the success of Katandra Ambassador the Askews did very well with many others including Katandra Silvermine 144 VHC. 1st 2 yo dry & Reserve Junior Champion at Melbourne Royal 75. 1st 3 yo in milk 76 & 1st 5 yo in milk 78. Her daughter Raywyn Fashionable Sunbeam was 1st 4 yo in milk & Reserve Champion Cow at Melbourne Royal 1984. Then her dtr R Trendy Sunbeam won her class at Melbourne twice, indeed 144's 3rd dam was the 2 x Supreme Champion at Melbourne—Silvermine 5 EX who was also the g dam of K Ambassador! Katandra Melys 93 (her 2nd dam was x Raywyn Ambassador) was Reserve Junior Champion Female at Melbourne Royal 76 & 1st 4 yo dry in 78. Her sons Raywyn Royal Challenge won Junior Champion at Melbourne 78 and Raywyn Fashionable Marina (x K Royal Incomparable) was Reserve Junior Champion in 79. Katandra Paxie 63 (x K Royal Wonder x R Ambassador) was the dam of Raywyn Fashionable Paul x K R Incomparable was Reserve Junior Champion at Melbourne Royal in 1980. Katandra Golden Lily 24 was a top cow, she won the 4 yo dry at Melbourne Royal in 76 and a month later as Champion Cow at

Warragul Fair. Katandra Melys 66 (her dam x Raywyn Ambassador) was purchased carrying Raywyn Melys 66 Incomparable, he proved very successful with several major Gippsland Champion dtrs & Melbourne Class winners, a son Raywyn Brendon Lee won Reserve Junior Champion at Melbourne Royal in 83 and sired Raywyn Brendons Helena the Reserve Junior Champion Female at Melbourne Royal 1987. The Katandra Star Kingdom (his 2nd dam x R Ambassador) son Raywyn Star Kingdom 2 won Junior Champion at Melbourne Royal in 84, now his dam was by Grand Ambassador. The herd sire Katandra Royal Incomparable, a son of Bluebelle 12 a Raywyn Royal Ambassador dtr was twice Most Successful Sire at Melbourne and did a great job at Raywyn.

Other winners in the 80's onward were Raywyn Golden Helena, the g dam of Brendons Helena above was Reserve Junior Champion Female Melbourne Royal 82 by R Maisies Incomparable a sone of Pals Maisie—Grand Pal dtr. And from R Priness Helena a Prince Manuel dtr. Raywyn Fashion Raleigh won Junior Champion Bull Melbourne Royal 86 he was from R Fahsionable Girl a K R Incomparable dtr. In 91 Raywyn Brilliant Lad a son of Fashionable Buttercup was Junior Champion Bull at Melbourne, his mat sister Raywyn Sweet Buttercup was Champion Cow Warragul Fair in 84. In 93 Raywyn Daisy Monarch was Reserve Junior Champion Bull at Melbourne. Then in 95 Raywyn Royal Hero a K Royal Jingo from Raleigh

Helena who was from Golden Helena (above) was Junior & Senior Champion Bull, he followed on in 96 being Champion Bull and was Reserve in 97. 1998 they won Most Successful Exhibitor along with Reserve Champion Bull, Raywyn Royal Power. 99 won 4 classes. 2000 again Most Successful Exhibitor & Reserve Champion Bull with Raywyn Brilliant Hero. 2002 was their last show at Melbourne, Raywyn Exotic Daisy who had won the 5 yo in milk in 2000 was looking great, but the judge missed her, she was a Belles Expo and showed much of the Duncan Beele look, her dam was a top cow by the Island sire Noble Natalies Dazzler the 3rd dam was Raywyn Princess Diana VHC, Champion Cow Warragul Fair & 2 x Reserve, a Prince Munuel dtr, she was a direct descendant of Glenavon Duchess 10.

I doubt there has ever been a Jersey Stud that can claim as many Championships at Melbourne Royal along with Sydney & Adelaide as Raywyn. Keith and Irene, as you can see bred to a bloodline. Their presentation of their large teams at shows was in their time simply outstanding—spotless! It is also worth noting that they also showed a few Ayrshires under the Silver Glen prefix, a bull SG Fortune sired many Champions at Adelaide Royal for the Davis family. Irene and her daughter Cheryl became famous for showing Poultry winning all over Vic & NSW, many times winning Bird of Show when over 700 were exhibited!

Constant Cheese Quality

- Cheese composition fully met food quality standards
- Cheese fat increased in autumn, winter and spring (maximum increase 18%)
- Cheese moisture decreased in spring and summer (maximum decrease 8%)
- Cheese protein, salt or pH levels were not modified

Financial Benefit

- Profit was increased when Jersey milk was included. The higher cheese yield always outweighing the higher milk price
- Cheese yield was the most important factor determining the level of additional profits while change in cheese price and milk price had a small impact, thus not putting the profitability by using Jersey milk at risk
- Using high inclusion of Jersey milk reduces fluctuations in additional profit due to change in cheese yield

Ease of Blending and Processing

- The recommended blending amount is the highest possible level of Jersey milk due to the important increase in yield and profitability and the lack of detrimental effect on cheese quality
- No change in processing was found to be necessary

The Jersey breed has a lower milk yield than Holstein-Friesians cows however, the milk has a higher fat, protein and casein content. In addition, this breed is well known for its increased longevity, higher fertility and lower feed and water requirements per unit of body weight.

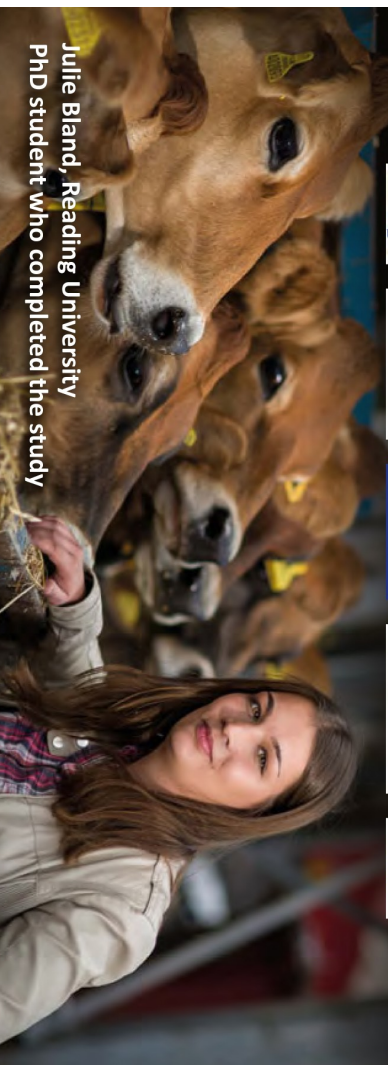
Hilmar is one of the biggest producers of Cheddar cheese in the world, processing over 9.5 million litres of milk per day; and using 30% Jersey milk in their California site and 55% Jersey milk at their Texas site.

The Jersey Milk for Cheddar Cheese Project

This study should remove any concerns about the effect which Jersey milk could have on Cheddar cheese texture or flavour – also demonstrating the Jersey milk attributes in a mature product.

In addition to the beneficial effect on cheese yield, using Jersey milk was also shown to reduce the carbon footprint and environmental impact of Cheddar cheese production.

An in-depth review of the compositional qualities of Jersey and Holstein milk was completed. This led to a better understanding of the effects of inclusion of Jersey milk into the standard milk supply to different levels on Cheddar cheese production, the process can be optimized, leading to benefits and financial gains to both cheese makers by increasing cheese yield and Jersey farmers by increasing milk demand. The project has been carried out by the University of Reading and sponsored by the following organisations:



Julie Bland, Reading University PhD student who completed the study

From the base research Cheddar cheese was produced using a wide range of inclusion rates of Jersey into Holstein-Friesian every month over a one year period in the University pilot plant.

The cheese making process mirrored that of Lye Cross Farm by using non-standardized milk, starter cultures.

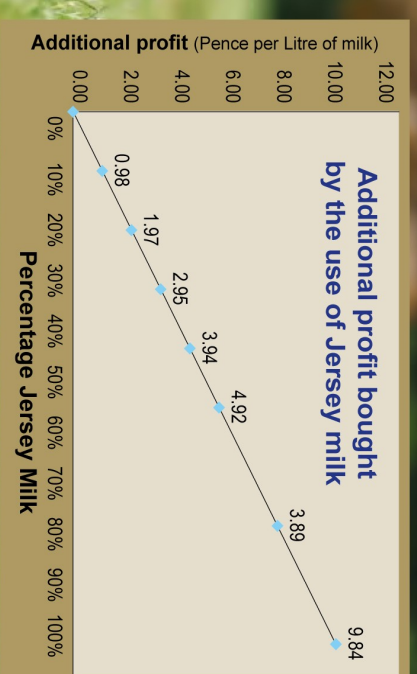
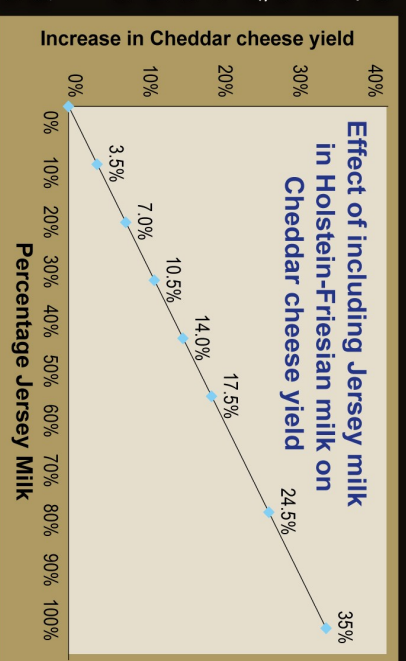
Additional commercial trials were performed at Lye Cross Farm to ensure the result from the pilot scale conformed to what would be found commercially.

All cheeses were analysed for yield, composition and sensory quality - the latter was evaluated by instrumental analysis of colour and texture, professional graders and sensory test using 280 consumers in total.

Higher Cheddar Cheese Yield*

- Increased yield throughout the year (up to 35%)
- Constant increase throughout the year
- Increased fat recovery (up to 30%)
- Increased protein recovery (up to 13%)

*Based on both pilot and commercial trial using unstandardized milk with an average Holstein-Friesian milk composition of 3.94% fat and 3.15% protein and Jersey milk composition of 5.43% fat and 3.74% protein.

Seven Hills Sleeping Beauty's



Our Sleeping Beauty family traces back to Lynbrae Sleeping Beauty 128 HC+, a Yarravale Royal Omen daughter that was the top producing cow in the Lynbrae herd over many years and most consistent breeding cow in 50 years according to stud principle Gordon Peak. Her HC+ classification was not a true reflection of this cow's true type, having only been classified once as a young cow in late lactation and lost before reclassification. She was the dam of both Sleeping Beauty 162 VHC and 166 SUP, the former being the top priced cow at the Lynbrae dispersal and the latter being the only cow retained by Gordon after the milking herd dispersal in 1992.

We were able to purchase the granddaughter of Sleeping Beauty 162 at the second stage dispersal; Lynbrae Sleeping Beauty 259 VHC, a Lynbrae Valley Beacon daughter out of Lynbrae Sleeping Beauty 221 Sup. Sleeping Beauty 259 VHC had 3 daughters, two of which gained a VHC classification, however only the first of these has progeny in the herd today.

This family is currently represented by seven members of which the 2 oldest are SH Sleeping Beauty 10 VHC 90 and SH Sleeping Beauty 11 VHC 92.
